### Overview

XLRI - Xavier School of Management, amongst India's premier B-Schools, completed its Summer Internship Placement Process (SIP) for its largest-ever class of 424 students (2020-22 batch) of the Business Management and Human Resource Management programs across both XLRI Jamshedpur and Delhi-NCR campuses. The highest stipend offered was INR 5 lakhs for two months in the BFSI Sector.

This year, the Summer Internship Process saw participation from 128 recruiters, including a record 41 first-time recruiters. The first-ever virtual placement season at XLRI saw the median stipend for the entire batch reaching Rs 1.20 Lakhs per month and an average stipend of Rs 1.09 Lakhs per month. This year the process was conducted entirely online with the 424-strong student pool attending the placement processes from their individual domestic locations.

As XLRI has one of the most prestigious HR Management programs in the country, participating firms also recruit for some of their most exclusive HR roles and programs amongst business management roles.

XLRI follows a semi-cohort process which gives both students and recruiters utmost flexibility and preference to choose from the top-tier talent XLRI has to offer. Amongst all recruiters, Amazon made the highest number of offers amongst the regular recruiters with 37 offers. The other top recruiters in terms of the number of offers made were BCG, Accenture Strategy, Citibank, ITC, and Aditya Birla Group.

New recruiters included top firms like Google, Walmart Labs, Adobe, Wells Fargo, Titan, Gartner, Honeywell, Dabur, Britannia, Sanofi, Novozymes, Beam Suntory and Perfetti Van Melle among others recruiting for both BM and HRM students at XLRI.

#### Recruiters and Trends

FMCG continues to be a strong recruiter for management students, with 83 offers where the highest offers were made by ITC (12) followed by Procter and Gamble (8) and Asian Paints, Reckitt and Nestle with 7 offers each. Offers were made across roles as diverse as Operations, Sales and Marketing, Human Resource Management, Finance, IT and General Management.





There was also participation from leading firms like Hindustan Unilever Limited, Colgate Palmolive, Coca-Cola, PepsiCo, Marico and the likes.

XLRI has been ensuring its hold as a Consulting and Product Management campus with an increase in offers in these domains over the years at XLRI. Amongst consulting firms, Boston Consulting Group was the top recruiter with 13 offers followed by Accenture Strategy and Bain and Company with 13 and 9 offers respectively.

XLRI also saw the participation of top-tier consulting firms like Kearney and niche consulting firms like Aon, Gartner, Everest Group amongst others which made offers to the students at XLRI.

This year saw a rise in Product Management as a domain with firms like Amazon, Microsoft, Media.net and Walmart Global Tech extending offers for their coveted Product Manager and Program Manager roles. In the IT and Consumer Technology firms, there was participation from Google, Samsung Electronics, Adobe and InfoEdge.

In the BFSI sector, Citi made the highest offers (12) followed by JPMC (7) across multiple roles including prestigious front-end roles like Markets. Firms like Goldman Sachs, Standard Chartered and Axis opened up their Investment Banking, Markets and Treasury roles which are highly coveted and exclusive across campuses. There was also an upwards trend observed from Pharma and Healthcare sector with 29 offers from firms like Johnson and Johnson, Cipla, Sanofi, Dr Reddy Laboratories and the like.

As India's oldest B-School, XLRI has hosted firms for roles that open to only select premier B-Schools such as Tata Administrative Services, Cappemini ELITE which gave 6 and 2 offers respectively. Amongst conglomerates, Aditya Birla Group and RPG Group were the largest recruiters selecting 11 and 7 students for their corporate offices and subsidiaries across various domains. There was also participation from Mahindra, Vedanta and 3M amongst the conglomerates.

XLRI also saw participation from some of India's leading e-commerce brands like Amazon,
Uber Flipkart, Myntra, Udaan, Cloudtail, Oyo and Ola which recruited a total of 49 students
