Overview of the postgraduate programme in agri-business management (PGP-ABM) summer placements 2015

The PGP-ABM summer placement process for the Class of 2016 was completed successfully on November 15, 2014. Out of the total batch of 49 students, 46 sought placements through the institute and were placed in less than a day. The remaining three students opted out for entrepreneurial projects through Centre for Innovation Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE), IIM-Ahmedabad.

The students chose roles that best fit their career aspirations in agribusiness and allied domains. The robust placement process was appreciated by both recruiters and students, effectively matching talent and opportunities.

The programme was well-received by the industry as a provider of high quality talent to the agribusiness sector, from which 25 companies participated in the placement process. The batch attracted a diverse pool of recruiters, ranging from MNCs to small and medium enterprises as well as notable start-up firms. Axis Bank, Godrej Agrovet, Monsanto, Mother India Farms, Nestle, Rabobank, Sakthi Group, Syngenta, SV Agri, Suez Environment, Tetra Pak, and Tafe were among the top recruiters. Notably, two students got the opportunity to pursue internships both in France and India.

A variety of roles were offered across diverse domains including agricultural inputs, consulting, corporate banking, and fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG). Various roles available to students included business development, marketing, logistics and supply chain management, sales, plantations, rural banking, and general management.
